# 24. Computerization of administration and the process of admissions and examination results, issue of certificates:

- \* Administrative work and financial records are totally computerised. Tally 7.2 software for accounting, Masters software for Pay roll, Shrileepi software for Devnagri typing, e-TDS software for Income Tax and MS Office for other office work are used. All computers of the office are connected by LAN.
- \* Internal examination marks are submitted to the University in computerised format.
- \* Computerised merit list is displayed at the time of admission.
- \* Admission forms for entrance examinations for courses such as MCA and Biotechnology are made available on the College website. Merit list of students admitted to the course are displayed at the website.
