

#### **Examination Pattern:**

A Term end examination is held in the month of October for 60 marks (converted into 20 marks) and Annual examination for 80 marks (total 20+80=100).

For Practical subjects, an oral examination is held annually carrying 20 marks in addition to a theory termend exam and annual examination of 80 marks (converted into 60 marks, total 20+20+60=100). Theory and Practical examination have individual passing i.e. 8 out of 20 (Practical) and 32 out of 80 (theory). Student gets a fail result if there is a backlog in two practical examinations. Minimum 40 marks out of 100 are required for passing, in case of non-practical subjects.

#### General Instructions

- EVS, Environment Awareness Course is compulsory for all S. Y. B. A. / S. Y. B. Com / S.Y. B.
   Sc. Students. Passing in EVS is mandatory to acquire a Degree Certificate. Grades are awarded for this subject.
- Passing percentage in all subjects is 40 %.
- ATKT rules are applicable as per University norms.
- Internal examinations will be conducted only once per semester / term.
- All the first year level (F.Y.) examinations will be conducted by the college itself as per the University guidelines.
- Medical check up is compulsory for students of first year of all the faculties. **Students who do** not fulfil this condition will not be permitted to appear for Annual examination.
- Students of first year of all the faculties have to appear for Physical Education examination.
   Students who do not fulfil this condition will not be permitted to appear for the Annual examination.

### A student appearing for the examination must obey the following instructions:

#### A. While entering the examination hall

- Make sure that you are not in possession of any material such as books, note-books, scribbled notes, mobile, etc., which may tempt one to copy or use as a reminder.

# CO-CURRICULAR AND EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

**Swar Madhuri**: Started in Jan. 1994, an Inter-Collegiate Classical Vocal and Natya Sangeet Competition organised by P.E. ## DISCIPLINARY RULES

### **Disciplinary Rules**

- a. Ragging is a cognizable offence (Government of Maharashtra Resolution NO. TEM / 10967620 / 96 dated 6 / 9 / 1996). Students are requested to **restrain from any form of ragging.** Violating this provision is punishable by law. As per the UGC Draft Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in higher educational institutions, 2009, every student will have to sign an Undertaking to refrain from Ragging, along with the Admission form.
- b. A Cell against Harassment and Atrocities against Women is functioning in the College in keeping with the Supreme Court guidelines(Vishaka guidelines).
- c. Smoking is strictly prohibited in the campus.
- d. As per the Pune University Rules, a minimum of 75% attendance is essential; failing to which action will be taken as per the rules.
- e. The student should be aware that four wheeler commuting to the College and four wheeler parking for students is strictly prohibited.
- f. The student shall park the vehicle in the parking space provided by the College for students and pay the charges. If the vehicle is parked in adjacent space, College will not take responsibility of it.
- g. The student shall not consume tobacco, drugs, pan parag, gutkha, liquor and other things which are injurious to health.
- h. The student shall switch off his/her mobile while in College premises.
- i. It is compulsory to wear I-card in the college campus

### Maintenance of Discipline and Good Conduct by Students.

Section 87 & section 39 (III) of the Pune University Act, 1974.

### 1. Every Student of Modern College shall at all time

i) Conduct himself properly, ii) maintain proper behaviour, iii) observe strict discipline both on the campus of the college and also outside, in buses, railway trains or at Public places or at picnics or education trips arranged by the College or at playgrounds, iv) ensure that no act of his / her consciously or unconsciously brings the College into disrepute. v) Shall not lodge any complaint or make any representation regarding any matter connected with the College to the press or other media.

### Any Student who behaves contrary to the provisions of following clause:

- 1) shall constitute **misconduct** and / or **indiscipline** which terms shall mean and include, among others, any one or more of the acts jointly or severally, mentioned hereinafter, namely-
- (i) any act that directly or indirectly causes or attempts to cause disturbance in the lawful functioning of the college,

- (ii) habitual unpunctuality in attending lectures, practical, tutorials and other courses as may be prescribed,
- (iii) repeated absence from lectures, tutorials, practical and other courses as prescribed,
- (iv) canvassing for or accepting contributions or otherwise associating himself or herself with raising of any fund or any object whatever without the previous sanction of the principal,
- (v) securing admission in the college to any undergraduate or postgraduate programme or any other course by fabrication or suppressions,
- (vi) Obstruction to any students or group of students in his or their legitimate activities, whether in the classroom, laboratories, fields, playgrounds, gymnasium or place of social and culture activity within the campus of the college.
- (vii) possessing or using fire arms, lethal weapons, explosives or dangerous or corrosive poisonous or stupefying drug or intoxicant in any form in the college.
- (viii) ragging, bullying or harassing any students in the college or outside thereof,
- (ix) to any other student or the authorities of the college or to staff member, or any member of the family of the staff.
- (x) indulging in any act of violence, assault, intimidation or threatening in the College or outside thereof,
- (xi) destroying or attempting to destroy or tamper with any official record or document of the College,
- (xii) conduct unbecoming of the student at any meeting or special function or sports and culture activities arranged by the College or at any other public place,
- (xiii) stealing or damaging any property belonging to the college, staff member of the college or any other students,
- (xiv) instigation or participating in any gherao of any official or staff member of the college,
- $(xv) \quad \ violation \ of \ any \ of \ the \ rules \ and \ regulations \ of \ the \ college \ or \ orders \ of \ the \ Authority,$
- (xvi gambling in any form in the college,
- (xvii) refusal to appear to give evidence before Enquiry Officer appointed by the authority with respect to a charge against him,
- (xviii) disorderly behaviour in any act specifically forbidden by the authority.
- (xix) conviction on the Court of Law for criminal offences, involving moral turpitude,
- (xx) any other act not specifically mentioned hereto before which whether, by commission or omission, as would in the circumstances of the case, be considered by the Authority as an act of misconduct and/or indiscipline.


