

## **Annual Report of Department of Psychology, 2015-16.**

### **Disha, Psychology Study Circle Activities:**

1. **10<sup>th</sup> July 2015, Group Discussion on ‘Self’**, Introduction of Disha to new members. The Disha group members welcomed and oriented new members to the activities of the group. The students gave brief introductions about themselves and what they did in Disha. The students discussed about their identities.
2. **13<sup>th</sup> July 2015, Talk on ‘Cultural Psychology’ by Dr. Sunil Bhatia**, Professor & Chair, Human Development Department, Connecticut College, U.S.A. Dr. Bhatia spoke about his work in Cultural Psychology; the students eagerly participated in the discussions, asked questions and enjoyed the talk.
3. **‘Careers in Psychology- Research’ By Sachin Shinde**. Alumnus of our college Sachin Shinde spoke to the students about his experience in the field of research. The students related to him and were inspired by his struggle, journey and achievements.
4. **Presentation on ‘Why we hate studying and How to Improve Study Skills’ by Dr. Suvarna Bobade**: The students first discussed their attitude towards studying and the reasons they hate to study followed by study skills tips given by Dr. Suvarna Bobade.
5. **World Suicide Prevention Day and World Mental Health Day**: Meaningful notices were displayed on 10 September and 10 October to spread awareness.
6. **8<sup>TH</sup> JAN 2016- Release of the Kaleidoscope Magazine Volume VIII** on the theme ‘Media and Psychology.’ There was a panel discussion with Mr. Nikhil Khaire who runs an advertisement firm. Our Chief Guest was Dr. Bharat Bhushan, Dean Academics YASHADA. He spoke about the linkages between media, communications and Social Science, especially Psychology. The students hosted the release function and brought out the colourful and interesting magazine, Kaleidoscope.

7. **28<sup>th</sup> JAN 2016, Group Discussion on Confidence** Students with the help of the Disha co-coordinators had a group discussion on the concept of Confidence, its meaning, why sometimes we lack it and how it can be developed.
  
8. **29<sup>th</sup> JAN 2016 Visit to Women's Studies Centre, SPPU** The faculty members accompanied the students to the Women's studies centre at the University. The faculty member of Women's Studies first showed us a short documentary on 'All pervasive Violence', followed by a discussion on the film. She also gave students information on Gender Studies as a discipline. The students participated in the discussions and showed interest in the new subject. They also visited the library.

## **DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITIES**

**Classroom activities:** Group discussions, role plays, group work, presentations, assignments, quiz, collection of news- paper item on themes of Psychology and notice board displays on relevant themes was done throughout the year.

1. **16<sup>th</sup> September, 2015, PSYWORLD:** To commemorate the completion of 100 years of Psychology in India, the Department had a Psychology fair titled PSYWORLD. The primary objective was to create awareness among the students and faculty about the world of psychology and put forward before them different aspects that the subject encompasses. The stalls put up for the event were drawing test, where students analyzed personality traits based on the figures that people drew. There were power point presentations on the topics Debunking Myths about Psychological Counseling and Debunking Myths about Mental Disorders with an aim to dispel myths. A handwriting analysis counter was arranged where the students and faculty could get their personality analysed through their handwriting. The meditation corner helped the visitors experience in brief what meditation is about. An initiative by a student, the micro expression gallery included pictures of some students depicting different expressions. PsyWorld was attended by about 215 students and 25 members of the faculty. The feedback received for the event was positive, encouraging and overwhelming.
  
2. **Participation in Anubhuti, the Science Exhibition:** SYBA Psychology students gave presentations on the topics Debunking Myths about Psychological Counseling and Debunking Myths about Mental Disorders in the Science Exhibition.
  
3. **Participation in Inter collegiate Photography competition:** Prithvi Bhushan, Shaantanu Kulkarni and Indrajeet Bhosale participated in this competition.
  
4. **1<sup>st</sup> March 2016 Parent Meet** An interactive meet was organized by the Department inviting the parents of the SYBA special students to visit the college. The faculty spoke about the subject matter of Psychology, the activities taken up by the Department and the involvement of the students. The Parents enjoyed this activity and thanked the Department for organizing the activity.
  
5. **8<sup>th</sup> March, International Women's Day Rally-** Students of SYBA along with the HOD attended the Rally held on the occasion of International Women's Day.

6. **18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> March, Visit to Babu Trust-** The faculty members along with two students attended the Dissemination Meet on Research, community Work and Campaigns organized by Babu Trust, a national organization working on mental health.

7. **Students' Achievements :**

- i. **6<sup>th</sup> JAN 2016- Young Psychologist Award, Christ University, Bengaluru.** The papers of three of the SYBA Psychology Special students were selected from among a hundred entries for the national competition held at Christ University. Our students, Pritvi Bhushan, Sonika Sharma and Shivani Vani made it to the top 16 and travelled to Bengaluru to present their paper. Sonika Sharma won the **First prize** and the title the **Young Psychologist of the Year**.
- ii. **8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> March, 2016, Chikitsa, Women's Study Center, SPPU-** Three of the SYBA Psychology special students: Shivani Vani, Sonika Sharma and Hemant Raghunauth presented papers on the topic 'Shadi ka Panchnama' a National Paper reading competition. Their papers were shortlisted in the final 30 papers among 200 papers from all over India.
- iii. **Hemant Raghunauth** was shortlisted as a finalist for Best Student competition. He also participated in the national ICCR event at Mumbai
