6.14 Initiatives taken by the institution to make the campus eco-friendly

- A. Energy Conservation: Recently the College has received First prize in 11th State Level Energy Conservation Competition organized by MEDA (Maharashtra Energy Development Authority) under Educational Institutional category
- **B.** Use of Renewable Energy: The College has 'Solar Wind Hybrid Power Generation Plant' that generates 13 KW power daily. Guests from three institutions have visited this project to learn about the benefits of this plant.
- **C. Water Harvesting**: The College is getting sufficient consumable water supply from Pune Municipal Corporation. The college has a rain water harvesting plant in the campus.
- **D. Tree Plantation**: Botany Department has renovated the Botanical Garden in the college campus. A tree plantation drive was conducted by the Staff academy of the college during the "Vasundhara Week" at Agricultural Biotechnology College of our parent Institution Various Saplings were planted during this drive.
 - On the occasion of Silver Jubilee Year of the college, the representative of first batch of our Alumni planted sapling in the college campus during Vasundhara Week.
- **E. Hazardous Waste Management-** Science departments have systematic mechanism of management of waste chemicals and other laboratory materials. The college has continued a contract with **Pasco Environmental Solutions** for safe disposal of hazardous chemicals and Bio hazardous waste. College has taken an initiative of recovery of solvents from used solvent waste. The college has installed **'Effluent Water Treatment Plant'** for t **e-** recovery of solvents from used solvent waste.

e-Waste Management:

The college has signed MoU with Kuldeep E-Scrap Material (Regd No: BO/Ro(HQ) HW/ E-Waste/Collection Center/2016/k/B-557) an authorized vendor of Maharashtra Pollution Control Board and declared as authorized E-Waste Collection Centre in India. Electronics Department will be coordinating the activities related to E-Waste collection in the College campus as well as from residential colonies.

e-waste collection drive was conducted by the Department of Electronics during the month of October 2016 for Staff and students of the college. Also the E-waste of Electronics (Total 123 Kgs) and Computer department (307 Kgs) was collected and given to above mentioned agency during September to November 2016. College has received Green Certification from this agency.

Criterion – VII: Innovations and Best Practices

- 7.1 Innovations introduced during this academic year which have created a positive impact on the functioning of the institution. Give details.
 - IQAC is actively involved in enhanced functioning of the infrastructure, library resources, instrumentation facilities and interaction with all stake holders of the institution. This has resulted in introducing some innovations during this academic year.
 - (a) Improvised methods are implemented for effective teaching and learning. These involve identifying slow learners and imply remedial teaching to them for better understanding. ICT based teaching involves use of internet, Google App, Flint etc. Students are motivated by a variety of ways like performing small projects, model making, cooperative learning, study visits, interaction with successful alumni, guest lectures, entrepreneurship training programs etc. Safety and disaster management workshops were conducted for staff and students.
 - (b) New skill based courses, hands on training and summer training programs are organized by science faculty for undergraduate and post graduate students. It has resulted in research publications.
 - (c) The teachers have raised a fund to help for college fees of needy students.
 - (d) Industry-Academic connect activities are done through linkages for summer training and projects for students.
 - (e) Feedback on Teaching is shared with teachers to create a positive impact on Teaching-Learning process.
 - (f) The library has created flipped classroom for educating patrons online and has introduced KOHA, D-space and FedGate search for all resources.
 - (g) Academic Audit has been done by the external professional agency, CEDA, Pune.
 - (h) Environment awareness related many activities are initiated such as
 - i. Use of solar and wind hybrid energy for generation of electricity of 13kv is being utilized for classrooms, corridors and administration office.
 - ii. Digitization of administrative processes and central documentation has helped to reduce carbon foot prints.
 - iii. Effluent water plant is installed which converts laboratory effluents into recyclable water which is then used for on-campus trees.
 - iv. Baction Compost Plant processes about 40 kg organic garbage and generates 5 kg manure which is used for the botanical garden.

FEEDBACK ANALYSIS REPORT 2016-17

1) Curricular Aspects

Analysis: More than 86% students feel that there is correlation between the syllabus studied in the previous year and syllabus studied in the current year in an excellent manner only 10% students feel it in an average manner. 4% students do not have opinion about it.

Action taken: Based on the feedback received from the students IQAC suggested to conduct bridge courses so as to enable the students to learn the curriculum. Department of Mathematics and Biotechnology have conducted bridge courses while Department of Microbiology has conducted bridge lectures.

2) Parents Feedback

Analysis: Almost all parents feel it proud to take the admission for their ward in Modern College, Ganeshkhind. Around 82% parents agree that the college admission procedure is fair and accurate. More than 80% feel that the discipline in the college is good and atmosphere in college is of learning and they found a positive change in their ward after joining the college. Also more than 75% parent regularly visit college website and found it informative.15% parents are neutral about their responses.

Action taken: College organises event for Mothers 'Aai Mazya Mahavidyalayat', 'Kisan Paalak Melawa' and Parent-Teacher Meetings so as to acquaint the parents about college activities.

3) Alumni Feedback

Analysis: The feedback taken from our alumni is very positive. Out of which, 91% alumni show positive inclination. Above 8% alumni are neutral about their views and about 0.01% do not agree.

Action taken: Faculty wise alumni groups have been created on social media so as to reach more number of alumni. Information about registered alumni association, its membership and activities is publicised through college website. A compilation of information on successful alumni has been published in a book form titled 'Modern Yashogatha'.

4) Infrastructure Feedback

Analysis: 85% students are satisfied with the services like availability of sufficient purified drinking water, student amenity centre etc. Also more than 32% students are satisfied on proper use of suggestion box, proper working of laboratory equipment,

functioning of placement cell. Moreover around 67% students are aware of first aid box, special facility for physically challenged student and parking services, fire extinguisher facility as well. All students are aware about solar wind hybrid power generation plant installed in college premises and are positive towards energy conservation and Management.

Action taken: Proper display boards and signage have been put up in the premises for making the students aware about available infrastructure. Cleanliness drive are organised regularly to clean the campus and also to develop ownership among the students.

Interpretation

Some of the spontaneous feedback as well as unsolicited feedback from other visitors have helped us to maintain the constant momentum in our success venture.

IQAC is taking due cognisance of feedback through a proper mechanism, analyses and tries to resolve shortcomings by involving concerned committees/departments. Routine matters are resolved at the institutional level while policy related matters are referred to the management. There is a challenge to maintain the satisfaction level of stakeholders.

Annexure-III

Best Practice I

- 1. Title of the Practice: Effective Teaching and Learning
- Goal: To make teaching and learning an enjoyable experience for students and learn life skills and make them confident, knowledgeable and responsible citizens having environmental and social awareness.
- 3. The Context: There are students from various socio-economic strata in the college. These also include students from different states and countries. It is required to identify their learning abilities and skills so as to make them finish the course successfully, inculcate values as well as develop their own personality and successfully tackle competition and challenges in life. This is achieved by many innovative and effective ways.
- 4. The Practice: Consistent efforts are being done for overall development of students. The teachers identify slow learners and fast learners by taking tests in the beginning of the academic year. Remedial teaching is done for slow learners. Seminars, quizzes, group discussions, model making, role plays, guest lectures, study tours are conducted for better understanding of the subject. Effective use of ICT based teaching is done regularly. Formation of subject groups on social media that includes teachers for interaction, use of Google scholar, interaction with successful alumni, discussion on recent research, participation in conferences etc. Teachers learn new pedagogies by participating in workshops and training courses and implement those in their teaching. Our library resources and ICT enabled classrooms support the same. Some teachers have uploaded innovative modules on the website and Google. Students do research projects and have published the work in reputed journal and filed for patents. A variety of students-centric activities are organized throughout the year. Intercollegiate competitions like Interaction by Computer Science Department, Cost Fest by Commerce Faculty, Modern Shree: a Sports event and Swarmadhuri, essay competitions are held every year. Interdisciplinary annual activities for students include Arts Circle, Wall Magazine, In-house research based publications, Kaun Banega History Scholar?, Modi Script Writing course, *Anubhuti*: science projects and Soft Skill Development workshops. Every year, faculty members raise a fund for loan scholarship to help needy students. Feedback of students is discussed with teachers to improvise quality of teaching. Academic Audit has been done by the external professional experts.

The registered alumni association 'Modernites' [No. F38148(P)] every year organizes *Vividha*: An Exhibition Cum Sale: Training of Business and Employability Skills' for all students and other stake holders which has motivated many students for self-employment. As a social connect the National Service Scheme team of the college collects tons of biodegradable offerings to deity during Navratri festival at Chatushringi temple and converts it into compost. Students assist farmers for weekly sale of vegetables from farms to college in Agro to Campus drive. NSS, Rotaract Club and Red Cross groups of college organize blood donation camps. Disaster Management and Safety workshops are conducted for students and staff. Placement Cell has helped on campus placement of many students.

- 5. Evidence of Success: The success measured is in terms of proactive participation of college teachers, students, alumni and parents and also evident from their feedbacks. It has also resulted in improvisation of results, increase in number of teachers and students doing research projects and opting for higher studies. The science projects which are demonstrable are appreciated by all the stakeholders and some may lead to product development. Three patents are filed in addition to research papers. Linkages and MOUs for research projects are also increased. Events like *Vividha* have motivated students for entrepreneurship which is a great step towards our 'Make in India' campaign.
- Problems Encountered and Resources Required: Crunch of space is an issue.
 More research funds should be procured for enhancing research.

Best Practise II:

- 1. Title of the Practice: Environment awareness Initiative
- 2. Goal: To take initiative in creating awareness of importance of conservation and preservation of environment among students, staff, all stake holders of the college and community by setting our own example.
- 3. The Context: Human race has excessively made use of natural resources without thinking of its aftermath. Every single person must proactively participate to save our environment. Extensive use of vehicles, cutting of trees, irrational use of water, paper and electricity only adds up to the threat to clean environment. We as educationists have come forward to take initiative to take measures to conserve and preserve our environment and motivate others too.
- 4. **The Practice:** The institution has a dedicated committee for Environment, Safety and Health. It monitors the campus and works in the context of environment

protection initiatives.

- (a) The Green Audit is done by professional external auditor.
- (b) The Green House Gases emissions quantification has been done in terms of carbon dioxide equivalents.
- (c) The administrative processes and central documentation has been digitized.
- (d) The college has become pioneer in use of renewable energy resources. Solar and wind hybrid energy is used for generation of electricity which is being utilized for classrooms, corridors and administration office. It has considerably reduced the need of standard electricity supply.
- (e) e-waste is generated from worn out computers, other hardware, mobiles, electric appliances etc. It consists of hazardous materials such as lead, zinc, lithium batteries, tin etc. Improper disposal of these products is dangerous for living beings. Hence MOU is done with MPCB authorized e-scrap centre. The e-waste and plastic waste is collected and given to this agency for proper disposal.
- (f) Students are sensitized and educated for segregation of wet and dry garbage. Organic waste including canteen waste is processed through Baction Compost plant. The manure generated is used for the botanical garden and other trees in the campus.
- (g) Every year National Service Scheme team of the college collects tons of biodegradable offerings to deity during Navratri festival at Chatushringi temple and converts it into compost. This initiative has generated environment related awareness in the society at large.
- (h) Effluent water plant is installed which converts laboratory effluents into recyclable water which is being used for trees in the campus.
- (i) Experiments are performed on micro-scale so as to minimize use of chemicals. Organic solvents are recovered after usage using rotary evaporators and reused.
- (j) Biohazard waste is detoxified and decontaminated before disposal.
- (k) Used papers and broken glassware is given for recycling.
- 5. **Evidence of success:** The use of solar and wind hybrid energy has reduced the electricity bill of the college by about 30%. Digitization of administrative processes and central documentation has helped to reduce use of papers. The college is almost made a zero waste campus because of all these practices.
- Problems Encountered and Resources Required: Efforts are required by each and everyone to contribute to the green campus. Financial aid is required to enhance these activities.
