## CJI bench pauses transfer of Armed Forces Tribunal Judge after Bar strike

THE SUPREME Court on Monday effectively stayed the transfer of a judge from the Armed Forces Tribunal's (AFT) Chandigarh bench to Kolkata and directed the tribunal's chairperson to submit in a sealed cover a report

detailing why the transfer was effected.

Following the transfer of Justice (retd) Dharam Chand Chaudhary, the AFT Chandigarh Bar Association had on September 26 launched an indefinite strike.

It also wrote twice to Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud, terming the transfer as "a direct assault on the independence of judicial functioning" of the AFT. It

alleged that Justice Chaudhary was transferred because "he refused to buckle under the pressure of the Ministry of Defence".

On Monday, a bench headed by CJI Chandrachud said that "pending further orders Justice Chaudhary shall not be required to assume charge at the regional bench at Kolkata". It also directed that "the execution petitions which have been heard by the
